

## Minimising the impact

Our proposals to reopen Westdown include a wide range of measures that will minimise possible impact on local communities.

**These include:**

- Volumes and HGV movements will not exceed current permitted levels at Whatley
- Extensive environmental mitigation measures to minimise the impact of our operations
- Highway junction improvements, with safer access for pedestrians and horse-riders
- Enhanced Public Rights of Way
- No increased footprint to the existing permitted area for Westdown quarry
- Operations would end at 20:00 Monday to Friday and 12:00 on Saturday and Sunday.

## Maximising the benefits

Our proposals for Westdown quarry will deliver a transformative legacy project through the progressive restoration of Asham quarry void.

An independent socio-economic study also found that continuing operations at Whatley and reopening Westdown would contribute over £2.2 billion to the national economy by 2042 plus £750.5 million in tax revenue over the same period.


**At a local level the two quarries will also:**

- Support over 200 jobs on site and 730 more in the regional supply chain
- Provide training and apprenticeship opportunities for young people
- Support local community initiatives through donations of time, money and materials
- Provide a tenfold increase in woodland area as well as other ecological and biodiversity enhancements.
