1	AGENDA Introductions Matters arising from minutes Planning Update NRW Update Padeswood Update Council Response AOB
2	MATTERS ARISING from the minutes Limit on CM3 from 30 mg to 20 mg needs to be clarified in item 5.
3	PLANNING UPDATE GN – Planning application gone in to sort out ground water monitoring, this will allow the Quarry to extract deeper. Milwr tunnel allows to go deeper as this brings the water table lower. MB – We have the right to go deeper but to go another bench then a water survey needs to be carried out. GN – If there was a requirement to pump and extract then the testing should cover the extraction license. GN – Areas of open fields or sensitive areas will limit further development in the area of the Quarry, this is a degree of protection. RJ – Would any development near the Quarry not fail planning anyway? GN – The buffer zone which stops development is a 200m exclusion zone from the Quarry boundaries. GN – Notification for footpath renewal has been raised. The Council has outlined that there is no evidence that the footpath has not been used prior to the site being built. A short section of path at the top of Bannell Lane has been renewed. RJ – How much time is left with the quarry? MB – 30 years of reserves remain, if we go deeper then it will extend the Quarry life but not by an additional 30 years. GN – Planning consent runs until 2042.
4	NRW UPDATE SR – Dust samples were high on Easter weekend EW – 2 samples have come back with 35-40% pollen, the remaining material was difficult to tell what it was. However, we are still awaiting the remainder of the results. SR – Odour complaints have been very inconclusive. SR – Noise complaints have risen, six since last meeting. Previous complainant has complained again but there was no outcome in the past from previous property. SR – No issues on the process in correlating with the complaints from Padeswood Lake Road, more monitoring to be carried out in order to assess the noise levels. This will be agreed as a scope with NRW. MB – Complaint today, noise levels at 90-95Db from a local tip at the end of the road. RJ – They are not supposed to be working in the tip? SR – A formal report will be made with regards to the tip locally, this will be carried out by NRW and the Council. GN – We will investigate the operations. RJ – Should the noise from this quarry not be resolved before Hanson Carry out some monitoring? EW – We are looking more at frequency rather than overall noise levels, this will be a more in depth survey based on frequency. JC – Thanks to Hanson for the forward thinking on the noise surveying, it's good to see they are being proactive and taking corrective action. SR – Final note on noise and dust, this is the first contact that NRW have had with the complainants. JC – Some locals that he knows regularly mention of no issues from the plant. MB – Outlines the issues experienced with specific complainants close to the works. SR – Part A went in for 29.03.2019 this was from an over pressurisation, Hanson are investigating the causes and effects.

	<p>MB – At the time the kiln was stopped, the kiln cooled and went unstable. When issues happen they are recorded, if the problem is a breach of permit then NRW are informed.</p> <p>SR – Site inspection 27.03.2019, inspection found concerns with containment of dust from doors on site. A lot of doors had been found to be open, some issues with housekeeping have arose. Dust emission from the crane store was found.</p> <p>JC – Clarified that some doors had been left open, some were damaged and some were missing.</p> <p>EW – Routine checks are carried out by the shift manager</p>
5	<p>PADESWOOD UPDATE</p> <p>MB – Cement Mill has been a success, one customer is still waiting to turn onto the new product.</p> <p>MB – The rail should be operational in Q2 this years, there is a small issue with the silos structurally that will be resolved.</p> <p>MB – The routine kiln stop middle of the year has been delayed due to high volumes on the site.</p> <p>EW – 2 additional complaints that have gone to the site and not NRW</p>
6	<p>Council Response</p> <p>RW – Have we finished building works on the site?</p> <p>MB – The construction has finished, final landscaping works on-going</p> <p>RW – We can smell an odour around the local area, it smells like grinding.</p> <p>CP – I can smell the same at the other side of Buckley, so it wouldn't indicate an issue from Hanson.</p> <p>MB – If this happens then please inform us, we can then communicate the findings if needed.</p>
