### **3.0 UPDATE**

#### **Health & Safety**

SU presented a selection of slides on Safety, Employee Survey, January Kiln Shutdown (£4 million), Cement Production, Capex Projects and Charity donations

#### **Quarry**

C3 is in 3<sup>rd</sup> year of restoration. Landfill has some leachate, monitoring is being carried out, closure maybe next year. No soil stripping this year. Restoration of F11 continues, by Autumn trees, shrubs, grass and clover will have been planted, decisions on the pond area need to be made

#### **Quality/Environment**

Noise from the Besta Building – Work was carried out during the January shutdown, but is still posing a problem, further monitoring needs to be carried out

Noise from the Rail – some work had been carried out on the auto greasing system, there will be no loading during quite time until this has been fully completed

## **Quarry Future Plans**

### **Proposed Quarry Extensions (Northwest land and Field 14)**

Discussions have taken place with Anglian Water regarding protecting the integrity of the feeder tunnel to Rutland Water. The feeder tunnel runs along the Northern boundary of the proposed NW extension at an approximate depth of 50 metres below ground level. It is proposed to revise the NW plans to pull back the limit of mineral extraction in a couple of areas along the Northern boundary. Changes have also been made to the plans for Field 14 to ensure the protection of the non-native Redwood trees on the Southeast corner of Paradise field. A Carbon Assessment is also being prepared to assess the carbon effects of the proposals and this along with updated plans and other technical assessments will be submitted as a single package (called an Addendum) to RCC later this summer. Once submitted a second round of consultation will take place providing everyone an opportunity to comment on the revised proposals

#### **4.0 Environment Agency**

Emissions throughout 2024 have been low. Stack and Cooler emissions were also low. Going forward into 2025 EA will be.

- agreeing outlining plans for the improvement of a range of dust plants & oil storage (Quarry)
- Reviewing the Climate Change risk assessments, this is to assess how HM will cope with the effects of climate change in the future.
- Landfill leachate has been recorded in the landfill cells and an investigation is required as to the cause.
- Water OMA, discharge into the river Chater, permit checks and best practise being followed
- Fire Prevention Plan
- Plan for cleaning vehicles to reduce plastic waste on verges

#### **5.0 Rutland County Council**

Local government re-organisation consultations taking place over the summer. A planning application has been submitted for Manor Green

#### **6.0 Ketton Parish Council**

An increase in plastic has been noted on Pit Lane and Fishponds, Stamford Road (EA to review this after the meeting)

**Action TF/KB**

The local bus service from Stamford-Ketton-Uppingham is to be axed in August. MC has met the new councillor for Climate Change and has suggested HM have a meeting with her. Extra land is required for KSC overflow car park – Savills will be contacting Nigel Roberts. HM is to supply prizes for the Duck Race at the Ketton Green Festival and also some literature on Carbon Capture. SR thanked HM for providing the coach for the trip to

the Queens Statue and then onto Burghley House for afternoon tea in June. VE celebrations on 8<sup>th</sup> May include a swing band and hog roast

The Church tower is being re-pointed in Phase 1 of the restorations. The village hall is being used now that the hall has an alcohol license
